

seminar and key-note speaker Dr. Bjorn Gustafsson, Professor, Dept. of Social Work, University of Gothenburg, Sweden presented a comparative analysis on two major inter-related issues: economic growth and child poverty reduction. Both the chairperson Prof. Dr. Profulla Chandra Sarker and key-note speaker Dr. Bjorn emphasised some valuable points on reduction of poverty based on the experiences gathered from China and Bangladesh.

Another seminar was held on "Gender Inequality, Trafficking, Sex Trade and Probability of HIV/AIDS" on 05 December, 2012. The Vice Chancellor Professor Dr. Profulla Chandra Sarker presented a paper on this issue. Professor, Dr. P.C. Sarker in his presentation highlighted gender inequality as a common phenomenon which was rooted from the instinct of religion and practiced widely in different phases of life cycle of women in

Bangladesh. He expressed in his speech that the young women were being victim of trafficking with the false hope of employment and marriage without dowry, and as a result, many of them were compelled to be involved in sex trade to survive. He mentioned in his speech that the AIDS was caused by infection with a virus called HIV/AIDS which is transmitted mainly through blood transfusion and sexual contact.

He put emphasis mainly on to what extent the parameters of gender inequality affect the women in trafficking and compel them to be involved in sex trade which ultimately might lead to the probability of HIV/AIDS in Bangladesh. Finally, he suggested the intervention of social workers through the implementation of behavior change model to prevent gender inequality, trafficking and HIV/AIDS.
